

LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 1991

SECTION 1.0

TITLE

1.1 This Local Law shall be known as the "Speed Regulation Law" of the Village of Cambridge, and may be cited as VOC 91-1.

SECTION 2.0

DEFINITIONS

2.1 As used in this Local Law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

2.1-1 HIGHWAY - The entire width between the boundary lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.

2.1-2 PERSON - Every natural person, firm, partnership, association or corporation.

2.1-3 VEHICLE - Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, including, but not limited to, any motorcycle or motor vehicle as defined in Sections 123 and 125, respectively, of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, and the acts amendatory and supplemental thereto.

SECTION 3.0

ESTABLISHMENT OF SPEED LIMITS

IN THE VILLAGE OF CAMBRIDGE

3.1 Speed Regulated By Conditions. No person shall drive a vehicle upon a highway within the corporate limits of the Village of

Cambridge at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions and having regard to the actual and potential hazards then existing.

3.2 **General Village-Wide Speed Limit.** Except when a special hazard exists that requires lower speed for compliance with Section 3.1 above, or when maximum speed limits have been established as hereinafter authorized, no person shall drive a vehicle upon a highway within the corporate limits of the Village of Cambridge at a speed in excess of thirty (30) miles per hour.

3.3 **Maximum School Speed Limits.**

(a) Whenever maximum school speed limits have been established and posted on a highway adjacent to a school in the Village of Cambridge, as authorized by the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, no person shall drive a vehicle at a speed in excess of such maximum speed limits during the school noon hour, school recess, while children are going to or leaving school during opening or closing hours, or while a flashing light or other similar automated traffic control device is operating to signal a reduced speed.

(b) For purposes of this Section 3.3, the following highways within the Village of Cambridge are hereby designated as having maximum school speed limits: (i) that portion of South Park Street in the Village of Cambridge which extends and passes generally north and south in front of the Cambridge Central School building and grounds and is marked by traffic control devices as a fifteen (15) mile per hour school zone; and (ii) that portion of Memorial Drive in the Village of Cambridge which extends from the Cambridge Central School building and grounds in a generally northerly direction to West Main Street and is marked by traffic control devices as a fifteen (15) mile per hour school zone.

3.4 **Maximum State Speed Limits.** Whenever maximum speed limits have been established and posted by the State of New York on

highways owned and/or maintained by the State of New York within the corporate limits of the Village of Cambridge, no person shall drive a vehicle at a speed in excess of such maximum speed limits at any time.

3.5 Maximum Speed Limits on Designated Highways. No person shall drive a vehicle at a speed greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour upon and along the following designated highway(s) in the Village of Cambridge, Washington County, New York, to wit:

(a) Jerome Drive.

3.6 Reduced Speed at Railway Crossings, Curves, Hills, etc. The driver of every vehicle operated upon a highway within the corporate limits of the Village of Cambridge shall, consistent with the requirements of Section 3.1 above, drive at an appropriate reduced speed when approaching and crossing an intersection or railway grade crossing, when approaching and going around a curve, when approaching a hill crest, when traveling upon any narrow or winding roadway, and when any special hazard exists with respect to pedestrians, or other traffic by reason of weather or highway conditions.

SECTION 4.0

POSTING OF SPEED LIMITS

4.1 The Superintendant of Public Works of the Village of Cambridge shall be empowered, and by this Local Law is hereby authorized and directed, to obtain official signs conforming to the Uniform Traffic Control Device Manual and the regulations of the New York State Department of Transportation, and to post such signs at such places upon or near the streets designated in Section 3 hereof as may be necessary to advise motorists of the maximum speed permitted thereon.

SECTION 5.0

ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

5.1 Any person who violates any provision of this Local Law

shall be guilty of a traffic infraction and shall, upon conviction, be subject to such fines and penalties as are provided in Sections 1800 and 1809 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, and the acts amendatory and supplemental thereto.

SECTION 6.0

VALIDITY OF LAW

6.1 If any term or provision of this Local Law, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall to any extent be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Local Law, or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term and provision of this Local Law shall be valid and be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

SECTION 7.0

REPEALER

7.1 This Local Law repeals in its entirety, and supercedes, Village of Cambridge Local Law No. 4 of the year 1987.

SECTION 8.0

EFFECTIVE DATE

8.1 This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon adoption and filing with the Secretary of State, as provided in Section 27(3) of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 9.0

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

9.1 This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the authority of

Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law and Section 1643 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York.


